WORKSHOPS & CPD Training

The Centre for Abuse and Trauma Studies can provide half day or one-day workshops, CPD training and in-house training for practitioners in criminal justice, health or social care services. This training serves to increase awareness of issues, provide definitions and indicators for assessment, latest research findings and how to bridge research practice in relation to recent policy. All training is delivered by experienced practitioners and academics.

1. Internet Abuse and Internet safety – workshops and training covering:

- Policing the Internet- introduction to legislation and context
- Investigating online grooming
- Working with young victims of Internet abuse
- Internet safety and protecting young people online

2. Working with young victims of abuse

- Achieving best evidence and the investigative process
- Abuse & trauma in young victims (including neglect; physical abuse; sexual abuse;
- Psychological abuse and bullying).
- Assessing Risk and Resilience in teenagers with adverse childhoods – the role of attachment style.
- Parenting style and abuse of children

3. Working with serious offenders

- Internet abuse – Understanding offending behaviour (indecent image collectors and online groomers)
- Assessment and Treatment approaches with sex offenders
- Criminal justice policy, legislation and ethical concerns in work with serious offenders
- Researching serious offenders
